Join the Pediatric Pandemic Network (PPN) <u>Disaster Response Collaborative</u> (DRC) to improve and demonstrate your children's hospital disaster response capabilities and capacities!

This two year collaborative starts in September 2024, and aims to build on the enhanced infrastructure achieved by children's hospitals during the PPN <u>Disaster Networking</u> <u>Collaborative</u>. Ultimately, the DRC will achieve improvements in coordinated pediatric disaster response in pediatric-specific focus areas, including 1) evacuation, 2) pediatric patient tracking and family reunification, 3) surge capacity, and 4) triage, infection control, and decontamination. Registered teams (one per children's hospital) will select one topic to focus their improvement efforts.

Involvement in your hospital's current disaster response is not required, nor is completion of the Disaster Networking Collaborative. Monthly 90-minute virtual (Zoom) sessions will provide educational information, quality improvement strategies, consensus-driven approaches, and opportunities and guidance to test out achievements through tabletop exercises and drills.

Our critical work has included the <u>Disaster Networking Collaborative</u> (DNC) which supported teams to enhance disaster preparedness in children's hospitals. We are now ready to launch the next phase in this exciting initiative - the Disaster Response Collaborative (DRC).

The PPN and Disaster Response Collaborative aim to support the implementation of the domains and recommended actions within the <u>EIIC Disaster Checklist</u>. For the DRC, prioritized focus areas include evacuation, pediatric patient tracking and family reunification, pediatric surge capacity, and addressing chemical/biological or infectious disease events through triage, infection control, and decontamination. Teams are only expected to choose one of the four identified focus areas to work on. Strategies, resources, and access to experts on these topics will be addressed in virtual/monthly collaborative sessions. Details on incentives such as access to a dashboard/portal and opportunities to observe or conduct a tabletop exercise and a pre- and post- drill will be available to track improvements. To achieve the goals of both the DRC and PPN, we kindly request your assistance in identifying the right point of contact within your institution to serve as a team leader. This individual will work with their team to engage in collaborative activities, aiming to improve readiness for response in a

disaster or pandemic and increase the influence of children's hospitals both internally and externally as well as response capabilities - focusing on an ongoing network prepared to provide optimal emergency care for children in an emergency, disaster, or pandemic. In addition, if you know of colleagues at other children's hospitals, particularly those that did not participate in the DNC, please encourage them to join.
